But at the time of birth the flap closes and seals the opening.


Now the child is independent and a lifetime of blood circulation and cleansing has begun.

Well, who designed "nature."


The watch didn't just have all the pieced fall in place of its own accord, the watch needed a watchmaker.

Earth is the only known planet equipped with an atmosphere of the right mixture of gases to sustain plant, animal and human life.


Astrophysicist Robert Jastrow, a self-described agnostic, (a person who is skeptical about the existence of God but does not claim to be an atheist) stated,

The Universe flashed into being, and we cannot find out what caused that to happen."1





Earth to Moon = 1.3 Light seconds








Earth to Sun = 8 Light minutes
