Introduction

ABOUT THIS ORDO

I. This liturgical calendar follows the **General Roman Calendar** (1969) adopted by the Order of Preachers and adapted for use in the Province of England and the Vicariate of St Louis Bertrand, including celebrations proper both to the Order and to the national and diocesan calendars where our priories and houses are erected.

II. Holy Days of Obligation are indicated on the preceding Sunday.

III. Certain celebrations (*viz*. Christmas, Epiphany, Ascension, Pentecost, Nativity of St John the Baptist, Sts Peter and Paul, and Assumption) have proper **Vigil Masses** in addition to the Mass of the day. These Vigil Masses are intended to be used either before or after First Vespers of the celebration.

IV. On Saturdays in Ordinary Time when there is no obligatory memorial, an optional memorial of the **Blessed Virgin Mary** is permitted, with its own proper reading at choice, at Mass and the Office of Readings.

V. The solemnities of the **Titular saint** and the anniversary of the **Dedication of the church** may, for pastoral reasons, be transferred to an ordinary Sunday or some other convenient day.

VI. Memorials which occur between 17 to 31 December inclusive and on weekdays in Lent (but not Ash Wednesday or within Holy Week) may be celebrated in the following **reduced manner**:

- i. At the Office of Readings, after the prescribed patristic reading (and its responsory), a proper reading about the saint (with its responsory) and the saint's collect may be added.
- ii. At Lauds and Vespers, after the concluding prayer, the conclusion may be omitted, and the antiphon and collect of the saint of the day (taken from the proper or common) may be inserted.
- iii. At Mass the collect of the saint may be used.

TYPOGRAPHY

- I. All celebrations, apart from optional memorials, appear with rank indicated after their title.
- II. Bold capitals indicate a solemnity, or Sunday in any liturgical season. If the celebration is universal, it appears as follows:

THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS, solemnity

If the celebration is peculiar to a particular local calendar, it appears in smaller type.

III. Capitals, not bold indicate a feast which, if it is universal, appears as follows:

ST ANDREW, APOSTLE, feast

If the celebration is peculiar to a particular local calendar, it appears in smaller type.

IV. Bold, not capitals indicate a weekday in any liturgical season, or obligatory memorials. If the celebration is universal, it appears as follows:

St Lucy, virgin, martyr, memorial

If the celebration is peculiar to a local calendar, it appears in smaller type.

V. Small italics always indicate optional memorials, and are introduced as such. Liturgical colours are shown in brackets if they differ from the universal colour of the day.

Optional: Our Lady of Guadalupe (W)

Memorials of reduced celebration appear as follows:

Optional: St John of Kenty, priest; as a commemoration

- VI. All Sundays and solemnities, as well as feasts of the Lord are shaded in grey.
- VII. Celebrations, and options from the Dominican proper are indicated by a shield:
- VIII. Impeded feasts and permanently impeded obligatory memorials are noted.
- IX. Readings are given on Sundays, solemnities, and feasts of the Lord, as well as other festal days that have proper readings not yet indicated in the current vernacular lectionaries. Psalms are numbered according to the Neo-Vulgate.

Volume I of The Divine Office is required from First Vespers of the first Sunday of Advent.

LECTIONARY: Sundays, Solemnities & Major Feasts - Cycle B Weekdays - Year II

Advent has a twofold character: as a time to prepare for the solemnity of Christmas when the Son of God's first coming to us is remembered; as a season when that remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, the season of Advent is thus a period for devout and joyful expectation. (GNLYC, 39).

During Advent and Christmastide we are asked to pray for these intentions: Openness to the Word of God; Migrants and Refugees; Expectant Mothers.

The Gloria is not sung on Sundays in Advent.

The playing of the organ or other musical instruments and the decoration of the sanctuary with flowers should be done with due moderation, in keeping with the character of this season, without anticipating the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord (GIRM, 305; 313).

The same moderation should be observed in the celebration of Matrimony.

Daily Masses for the Dead are not permitted (GIRM, 381).

C H R I S T M A S T I D E

Next to the yearly celebrations of the paschal mystery, the Church considers nothing more important than the memorial of Christ's birth and early manifestations (GNLYC, 32).

The season of Christmas runs from First Vespers of Christmas until the Sunday after Epiphany or after 6 January, inclusive.

"The news of the coming of God, which was one day heard in the darkness, had the power to awaken the shepherds and to make the multitude of simple people go in haste to the inn. It attracted the learned so much that they set out on unfamiliar routes. It worried the mighty baffled by the resistance that gentleness and love can oppose to the vain pretentions of power. God came among men and women; and all of a sudden those who thought that they were forgotten by everybody found that they were invited to occupy the first place in the fulfilment of the promise. Those who felt tired of life stood up again, and those who felt crushed by guilt and sin grasped the hand that helped them rise again.

God comes personally to dialogue with his people, and the 'delicate silence of a gentle breeze' covers the world and opens the time of hope for a new creation..."

O R D I N A R Y T I M E

Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, thirty-three or thirty-four weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in its fullness. This period is known as Ordinary Time. (GNLYC, 43).

During Ordinary Time up to Lent, we are asked to pray for these intentions: Peace on Earth; Christian Unity; The Sick and Those Who Care for Them; Students and Teachers; The Unemployed.

LENT

Volume 2 of The Divine Office is required from Ash Wednesday.

Lent is a preparation for the celebration of Easter. For the Lenten liturgy disposes both catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery: catechumens, through the several stages of Christian initiation; the faithful, through reminders of their own baptism and through penitential practices. (GNLYC, 27).

During Lent we are asked to pray for these intentions: Candidates for the Sacraments; Women; The Needy and Hungry of the World; Penitents and Wanderers.

The Alleluia is always omitted at Mass and Office.

Violet

The Gloria and Te Deum is not sung on Sundays in Lent but is retained for feasts and solemnities.

It is not permitted to decorate the sanctuary with flowers, and the organ and other instruments should be silenced, unless they are truly necessary to sustain singing. An exception is made for Lætare Sunday, solemnities, and feasts (GIRM 305, 313).

The same moderation should be observed in the celebration of Matrimony.

Votive Masses and daily Masses for the Dead are not permitted, and the weekdays of Lent take precedence over the memorials of saints, so that they may only be commemorated in the manner described in Art. VI of the 'About this Ordo' section in the Introduction of this volume (GIRM 355a).

In addition to Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, fasting and abstinence are required of members of the Province on one day during Lent, for justice and peace.

HOLY WEEK

In Holy Week, the Church celebrates the mysteries of salvation accomplished by Christ in the last days of the earthly life, beginning with his messianic entry into Jerusalem (DPL, 138).

All feasts and memorials are omitted during Holy Week, although solemnities are transferred to a suitable date after the Easter Octave.

Sacristans may note that on Maundy Thursday the Tabernacle should be empty at the beginning of Mass.

EASTER TRIDUUM

Christ redeemed humankind and gave perfect glory to God principally through his paschal mystery: dying he destroyed our death and rising he restored our life. Therefore the Easter Triduum of the passion and resurrection of the Lord is the culmination of the entire liturgical year (GNLYC, 18).

5 THU THURSDAY OF HOLY WEEK: Evening White ('Maundy Thursday')

MASS: of the Lord's Supper, *Gloria* (with bells), preface of the Eucharist I, proper *Communicantes, Hanc igitur* and *Qui pridie*, and proper readings

Ex 12:1-8. 11-14; Ps 115:12-13. 15-16bc. 17-18; 1 Cor 11:23-26 Jn 13:1-15

From the Gloria this evening, bells are silenced until the Easter Vigil. The Washing of Feet customarily takes place after the Homily, although the Proprium Missarum O.P. also allows for it to be done outside of Mass.

The altars are stripped and crosses removed after the Blessed Sacrament has been taken in procession to the Altar of Repose. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is encouraged; after midnight this should take place without ceremony.

Holy water should be emptied from the stoups, and left empty until after the Easter Vigil.

OFFICE: Vespers is not said by those who attend the Mass of the Lord's Supper; Compline as after II Vespers of Sunday

The Last Supper discourse (Jn13:31-17:26) may be read in the vernacular at the main community meal, or in place of Compline at the end of the day in common before the reposed Blessed Sacrament.

6 FRI GOOD FRIDAY

Red Day of Fasting and Abstinence

LITURGY OF THE LORD'S PASSION: as in the Missal, general intercessions, veneration of the cross, communion rite, and proper readings

Isa 52:13-53:12; Ps 30:2 & 6. 12-13. 15-16. 17 & 25; Heb 4:14-16. 5:7-9 Jn 18:1-19:42

The celebration should not take place before noon or after 9 p.m. The altar should be bare, devoid of cloths, cross, and candlesticks.

Veneration of the cross may take place following the form found in the Officia Hebdomadæ Sanctæ O.P. (1965). Crosses should be unveiled after the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion, and until the Easter Vigil, the cross is venerated with a genuflection on entering and leaving the church.

Communion may be given only in the Liturgy of the Passion, or at any hour to the sick.

In all churches and oratories the Pro Terra Sancta collection should be made: for those pastoral, charitable, educational and social works which the Church supports in the Holy Land, in fraternal solidarity with Christians there.

OFFICE: of the day (with *versus litanici* etc. at Lauds) *Christus factus est*; Vespers is not said by those who attend the Mass of the Lord's Supper; Compline as after II Vespers of Sunday

On Good Friday and, if possible, also on Holy Saturday until the Easter Vigil, the Easter fast is observed everywhere (GNLYC, 20).

7 SAT HOLY SATURDAY: During the day

OFFICE: of the day, *Christus factus est*; Compline as after II Vespers of Sunday, but this is omitted by those who attend the Easter Vigil The memorial of St John Baptist de La Salle is impeded.

Before the Easter Vigil, communion may be given only as Viaticum. No Mass may be celebrated during the day.

The blessing of the First Food of Easter may be given during the day (see The Book of Blessings).

All sacred images, if they have been veiled, are unveiled before the Vigil begins.

EASTERTIDE

The fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated in joyful exultation as one feast day, or better, as one "great Sunday." These above all others are the days for the singing of the Alleluia (GNLYC, 22).

During Eastertide we are asked to pray for these intentions: New members of the Church; Vocations; The right use of the Media; The Church; Human Work.

The Regina Cæli is substituted for the Angelus.
